Brent Vigen Football

Brent Vigen became Montana State's 33rd head football coach in 2021, and immediately set about making history. Vigen owns 24 wins in his first two Bobcat seasons, the most victories in any two-season stretch. He is the program's first head coach to lead the team to back-to-back appearances in the FCS Plavoff semifinals. Vigen's creativity and experience as an offensive architect shone brightly in his first two vears at MSU. The 2022 Cats finished second in the FCS in rushing offense, third in scoring offense, and fourth in total offense. Prior to MSU, Vigen spent seven seasons as offensive coordinator at the University of Wyoming. Before that he played (1993-97) and coached (1998-2013) at North Dakota State University, helping transition the Bison from a regional Division II power to an FCS dynasty. Mark Albert Motivation

Coach Albert recently retired from a 30-year career as a high school teacher and coach, the vast majority at Hamilton, where he taught personal finance and personal development to upperclassmen. He was the head boys' and girls' cross country coach for 20 years and spent two successful stints as the head girls' basketball coach, playing for the state championship in 2009, 2014 and winning it all in 2015. Mark's cross country teams won 5 state titles from 2008 to 2021 and he is a member of the 2022 MCA Hall of Fame. Mark and his wife Carla currently mentor young adults in their use of time and money, and speak to teachers and coaches about how a commitment to personal development compounds positively, impacting the students and athletes they lead. Phenicie is currently the Assistant Head Coach for the Grizzlies coaching the Tight Ends and Tackles under Bobby Hauck. As offensive coordinator at Montana from 2003 to 2009. Phenicie oversaw an offense that helped the Grizzlies to sevenstraight Big Sky championships and three National Championship game appearances. The 2006 All-American Football Foundation Assistant Coach of the Year led Idaho State from 2017 to 2021, earning a victory over FBS Nevada and a win over a ranked opponent every season he was at the helm. Tim spent 15 years Coaching at Pepperdine, where the women's volleyball team earned 11 NCAA tournament berths, advanced to the NCAA Regional Semi-Finals 4x, advanced to the Regional Finals twice and finished top ten in the AVCA rankings on 5 occasions. Shayne Wittkopp Track & Field

Shayne Wittkopp heads both the T&F and XC teams at Dickinson State. In 6 seasons, Shayne has led the Hawks to 14 conference North Star Athletic Conference Titles. His Blue Hawks hold 23 conference records, 19 most valuable athletes. and 133 individual conference champions. Wittkopp's Hawks have broken 17 DSU school records and had 15 NAIA All American performances. He has been recognized by his peers as North Star COY 14 times. Prior to DSU, Wittkopp was at Central Washington University ('09-'16). He began coaching collegiate track at Dickinson State in 2007 when he assisted with the jumps. Jason Nickal served 25 years as an educator and coach. As a wrestling coach Nickal led teams to ten state championships and over 55 individual titles. He was inducted into the Rio Rancho (New Mexico) High School Coaches Hall of Fame in 2018. He has served on the USA Wrestling State Board of Directors in Colorado, Wyoming, New Mexico, and Texas Jason's son Bo Nickal, 3X NCAA Champion and Hodge trophy winner, is currently competing in MMA and fighting in the UFC. Dan Pearson Basketball

Dan Pearson, a Billings native, is currently coaching in Germany where he assists with the Science City Jenna Pro Team. Pearson graduated from Billings Central prior to attending Carroll College where he played for the Saints (08-12). Dan first coached 2 seasons for Capital under Guy Almquist before returning to Carroll College to take his first collegiate position under Dr. Carson Cunningham for three years. Dan then moved to the University of Calgary where he coached with the Dinos for five seasons. During his tenure at Calgary, the Dinos competed in the Canadian Final 8 National Tournament in each season, earning Silver in 2019. Dan moved to England to coach professionally as the head coach for the Reading Rockets in England's National Basketball League. After one season with the Rockets. Dan moved to coach in Germany. Justin Udy Football

Coach Udy joined the Bobcat staff in 2020 as OC/QB coach. In 2021 he transitioned to receivers and special teams, and helped quide a productive and balanced Bobcat offense. One of the key cogs to the offense throughout the season, senior receiver Lance Mc-Cutcheon, set a Bobcat record for receiving yards in a season (1,219 yards) and earned 1st Team All-Big Sky honors along with a trip to the National Championship. In 2022 Montana State's Taco Dowler led the FCS in punt return yards (18.0) while Marqui Johnson finished 2nd in kickoff return yards (31.2) and helped lead Montana State to their first Big Sky Championship since 2012. Udy had earlier stints at Texas Tech, Utah State, South Dakota School of Mines, and Eastern Oregon. Topic: "Special Teams Circuit Work and Schemes"



Larry Jappe Football

Coach Jappe's entire coaching career has been in Big Sandy, where he began coaching 8-man in the late 90's, mostly as the junior high and varsity assistant. He was the head coach from '04-'06. After a hiatus from coaching, he returned as the junior high coach and assistant, this time in 6-man. In 2019, Jappe took over the head coaching position, compiling a record of 39-6 making the semi-finals each of his first 3 years, and then winning the state championship in 2022. Coach Arie Grey, a 2x MCA COY, heads both Football and Boys' T&F at Butte High with a 2021 State T&F 2nd and a State Football Title in 2012. He began his coaching career in 2003 at Flathead High, moving on to Butte High in 2008 where he assisted long-time T&F legend, Charlie Merrifield. Arie was a Powell County All-State three-sport athlete. He continued his outstanding athletic career at MSU as a 4-year letterman in both track and football. Topic "Weekly Game Prep"



Randy Bandelow Football

Bandelow just finished up his 4th season at Carroll College, his first as Defensive Coordinator, where he led the Carroll defense to national top-10, including 13 points per game. Carroll has won the Frontier Conference twice and made two National Playoff appearances in Bandelow's four seasons. Topic: "Carroll Defensive Schemes"

Anderson has coached the DB's at Montana Tech since 2020, and also serves as S&C Coordinator for the Orediggers. Matt learned from legendary coaches along the way. In high school he played for Coach Jack Johnson at CMR, in college it was Mike Van Deist at Carroll and the past 11 years he was mentored at Belt by Jeff Graham & Paul Maki. Selvig recently finished his 3rd season as Dickinson State's head men's basketball coach. His Blue Hawks had a strong 22-23 season, finishing T-2nd with a 9-5 record in conference play, splitting with UMW, RMC and UP during the preseason. Before DSU, Derek assisted at Billings West and then spent 4 seasons as the men's assistant at MT Tech.



Amber Erickson Basketball

Coach Erickson in her 21st year of coaching girls' basketball all at Saco. She has led her teams to the State Tournament 8X, bringing home a 3rd place trophy, three 2nd places and two State Championships. This year the Lady Mavericks won their first state title as a co-op finishing their season 26-0. Her overall career record is 366-150. Amber graduated from Superior. She continued her college career at MSU.

Layne Glaus Basketball

Layne just finished his 3rd year as Head Boys Basketball coach at Manhattan Christian and his first year there as AD. Prior to that, he coached at Park High for five years while serving as their high school athletic trainer. The 2023 season is Allison Lawrence's 7th as head coach and 14th overall with the Montana vollevball program. The Grizzlies have finished above their preseason prediction in five of the past six seasons, including 2022, when Montana earned its most wins and best winning percentage since 1999. The Grizzlies won seven non-conference matches and finished with a .583 non-conference winning percentage, the best marks in both categories since the 2005 season. McLean spent the previous eight years coaching successful XC and distance athletes at Glacier High. He helped restart the Flathead Valley Community College XC team in 1996. He coached the Highlanders T&F program for 24 years and spent four years as an assistant XC coach at Columbia Falls. Huls has been the head T&F coach at Corvallis for 20 seasons, taking the reins of the boys' program in 2004, and the girls in 2008.
