Do's and Don'ts of recruiting

Do's:

- Film Games!- No film is hard to get recruited, Players need access to it, They can make their own videos(screen record, clip, send full games).
- Talk to College coaches!- Introduce yourself, let them know if you have any kids that are wanting to continue playing. Ask if they are looking for a certain position. Share contact information.
- Send college coaches emails and INCLUDE film, stats, information on athlete(wanting to study, if they are looking at specific locations, etc)
- Be realistic- some players will not match up with a coach you are talking to. That's OK! It doesn't mean that the player won't find a place. Ask said college coach what level that athlete should realistically be looking at.

Don'ts:

- Do nothing
- Tell Athletes they are on their own and need to figure it out
- Discredit Athletes- If they want to go to college help them find a place. If you don't know where to start- contact a college coach for some evaluation.
- Think you need to pay- Not all recruiting needs to cost money
- Wait to be discovered- reach out!
- Don't mass email- reach out to schools you are interested in, make the email personal- why choose that school, what sticks out?

Resources:

- Coaches- Network! Meet new people, exchange information!
- Film- That alone is a huge resource to getting recruited
- Email- Reach out! Always attach film.
- Social Medias- Add clips there, share with coaches, let them get to know you on a personal level as well
