

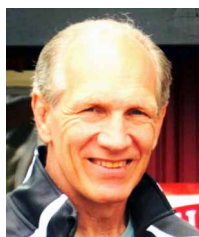

Mitch Hull
Keynote

Mitch Hull serves as National Director of Professional Development at 3D Institute, helping schools build an appealing sport culture that positively impacts lives. His focus is 1) helping schools build systems and processes that are essential in leading, managing and sustaining sport culture 2) leading coaches to identify their purpose, and providing tools to help them maximize that purpose, on and off the field of play. Coach Hull assisted wrestling at Wisconsin followed by 4 years as head coach at Purdue. He left coaching to serve as the National Teams Director for USA Wrestling. Mitch enjoyed State and National HS wrestling titles. At Wisconsin, he was a 2X Big Ten Champion and 2X All-American. Her experience includes coaching the 2025 state champion Gallatin Lady Basketball team, the 2022 runner up and 2023 state champion Billings West Lady Bears volleyball team, Fairfield volleyball team, CMR tennis teams, and the Kenyan national junior soccer team. She's also worked with standout athletes such as Florida Gators - Hilda Olemomoi, 2024 NCAA 3rd place national cross-country finisher and 3 fastest 5,000 meter runner in history, Brienne Bailey, 2024 Idaho triple jump state champion and Idaho basketball player of the year, Aspen Giese, MSU-Billings 2nd team All-GNAC, and Abby Clark NAIA All-American Heptathlete. Robbie Caldwell
Football

Caldwell joined Clemson as its OL Coach in 2011, helping the Tigers to a 131-21 record, 11 10-plus win seasons, 7 ACC titles, 4 CFP National Championship games and 2 National Championships in his 11 seasons guiding the unit. In his final 7 seasons, Caldwell's unit produced 25 ALL-Conference selections, the second-most of any Power Five program in that span. Before Clemson he coached at Hanahan HS '77, Furman (OL/Strength Coach) '78-'85, NC State '86-'99, UNC 2000-01, Vanderbilt '02-'09, (HC Vandy 2010). He coached 532 games at college level, retired off the field after the '21 season, and now is the Director of HS Relations for Clemson Football. Robbie was a 3 year Letterman at Furman (MVP senior year-only center in history at Furman) and Furman HOF inductee in 2019 for contributions as both a player and coach. Arthur Moreira
Basketball

Coach Moreira just completed his 1ST year at the helm of the University of Idaho Women's Basketball Program. His Lady Vandals finished the 24-25 season strong at 18-12, placing 3rd in the Big Sky Conference. Moreira brings a great depth of international connections and knowledge, having served as an assistant coach for the Brazilian Basketball Federation. He was part of the coaching staff that led the U19 National Team in the 2023 FIBA U19 World Cup, serving as the defensive coordinator and being responsible for scouting and game preparation ahead of every contest. Prior to Idaho, Moreira spent 7 seasons at the University of San Francisco as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator, leading the Dons' international recruiting efforts. Colby Blaine
Basketball

Colby Blaine began at the College of Idaho in 2014 and became head coach in 2018. In 7 seasons Blaine achieved an incredible 120-8 conference record and all-time 205-30 record. His Yotes had an outstanding '24-25 season (35-2), winning the conference and bringing the NAIA National Championship Trophy home for the 2nd time in 3 years. In '22-23, he led the Yotes on a 36-game winning streak, the most wins of any college basketball coach in Idaho history. In '21-22, Blaine became the fastest coach in program history to the 100-win mark. He was named the Cascade Collegiate Conference COY in '20, '22, '23 & '25 and was honored as the '23 & '25 NABC & NAIA National COY and the '20 NAIA National COY. Shayne Wittkopp
T&F

Sprints & Relays

Shayne Wittkopp heads both the T&F and XC teams at Dickinson State. In 6 seasons, Shayne has led the Hawks to 15 conference North Star Athletic Conference Titles. His Blue Hawks hold 26 conference records, 22 most valuable athletes, and 132 individual conference champions. Wittkopp's Hawks have broken 21 DSU school records and had 15 NAIA All American performances. Prior to DSU, Wittkopp was at Central Washington University ('09-'16). He began coaching T&F at Dickinson State in 2007 assisting with the jumps. As a Blue Hawk athlete, Wittkopp was a 6X national qualifier, and a top ten Triple jump finisher at the NAIA National meet. Moe Boyle
Volleyball

Moe Boyle has been Head VB at Carroll since 2005. Her Lady Fighting Saints had a strong start to the 2024 season, vaulting into the NAIA National Polls following a terrific non-conference slate, spending the better part of the season ranked, or receiving votes, and notched several ranked wins on the year. In 19 seasons, her volleyball program has accumulated a 322-234 record, making it to the NAIA Regional Tournament in '05 & '06 and the national tournament in '12 & '16, with her Saints averaging 18 wins/season. Prior to Carroll, Coach Boyle spent 5 years each at Helena Capital and Flathead. Topics: "Hitting Drills w/ Defense" & "Practice Competitions"



Rob Phenicie
Football

Entering his 37th year of collegiate coaching, Rob Phenicie returned to Montana in 2022 after a five-year run as head coach at Big Sky rival Idaho State. Phenicie is currently the Assistant Head Coach for the Grizzlies and coaches the Tight Ends under Bobby Hauck helping the Griz to a 2023 Big Sky championship and National Championship appearance. As offensive coordinator at Montana from 2003 to 2009, Phenicie oversaw an offense that helped the Grizzlies to seven-straight Big Sky championships and three National Championship game appearances. The 2006 All-American Football Foundation Assistant Coach of the Year led Idaho State from 2017 to 2021, earning a victory over FBS Nevada and a win over a ranked opponent every season he was at the helm. Football

Sean Herrin is entering his 5th year as the Director of FB S&C at Montana State. He is a Montana native who attended Helena High and was a member of 3 national championship football teams at Carroll College between '04-09. At Montana State he has been a part of two Big Sky Championship teams ('22, '24) and two FCS National Championship runner-up teams ('21, '24). Since 2021 he has helped develop 21 All Americans, 2 NFL draft picks, and several current NFL players. Sean has had great coaches and mentors during his time as an athlete and therefore is heavily influenced by: Kevin Herrin, Mike Van Diest, Jim Hogan, Nick Howlett, Tony Arntson, Steve Keller, Jason Murgel, and many more. Dustyn Azure
Wrestling

Dustyn Azure has spent 9 seasons at the helm of University of Eastern Oregon's Men's Wrestling program. He also served as the head coach for the women's wrestling program for 3 seasons garnishing 2 top 20 finishes and coaching 4 individual All-Americans. While leading the Mountaineers, he has produced one National Champion, 13 individual All-Americans, six top-20 finishes at the NAIA National Tournament and 6 top-10 NWCFA Scholar All-American team awards and has totaled 42 Individual Scholar All-Americans. He was named the CCC COY in back-to-back seasons for '20-21 & '21-22. Azure led the Mounties to their first CCC Championship in the 2021-22 season. Troy Purcell Football

Troy Purcell has 34 years of coaching experience at the FBS, FCS, NAIA, Montana AA, A, B levels in Montana and Oregon. Purcell started his coaching career in Stayton Oregon at Regis High School and then moved back to Montana and coached at Lincoln County, Havre and Bozeman High Schools. He then moved to the University of Utah to coach for Paul Petrino and currently Troy is the 21st head coach at his alma-mater Carroll College. Purcell has won 206 games as a head coach and garnered multiple State and Conference Championships. Topic: Developing Good Culture and Program Philosophy.



Thomas Dilworth Football

Thomas Dilworth began his coaching career at Big Sandy High School, leading the boys' basketball team for five seasons. In 2024, Dilworth transitioned to Box Elder High School as head football coach, where he guided the team to an undefeated 11-0 season and a 6-Man state championship. Tyler Murray Football

Tyler Murray is entering his 5th season as the Head FB Coach/Offensive Coordinator at East Helena High School. Prior, Murray was at Mission High School in St. Ignatius, MT as the Head FB Coach for four years, Head T&F for two years, Asst. GBB for two years, as well as the AD in 2020-21. Tyler is a 2017 graduate of the University of Montana-Western and was a wide receiver for the Bulldogs. Last season the Vigilantes' offense ranked #1 in Class A for Yards Per Game, and #3 in Points Per Game. Topic: Intentional Install and Fall Camp Planning.



Kyle Mihelish Football

29-year MT Coach, Kyle Mihelish, has been the head mentor at Helena Capital since 2015. The Bruins have a 30-5 record the past 3 seasons while winning AA state titles in '22 & '24. He assisted Pat Murphy at Capital from 2005-14 with the Bruins playing for 6 state titles & winning 4. Mihelish was the Carroll D Line coach and part of the '04 National Championship. He played and coached at MT Western and was a part of 3 Conference Titles and 2 national semi-final appearances. Session 1 Topic: "Team Defense" assisted by defensive assistant, Jeff Mahana. Jace Schillinger Football

Jace Schillinger graduated from Baker High School in 2000 and recently completed his first year as head football coach at Sidney High School. He has had coaching stints at Baker High School, Billings Central, Park High School, and University of North Dakota. He was the offensive coordinator at his alma mater, Dickinson State, from 2014-2017. He then accepted a job at the University of Montana coaching Tight Ends from 2018-2020. Nick Oxarart Football

Nick Oxarart has coached football at Malta HS for 18 seasons (9 as an assistant and 9 as head coach). He started his coaching career in 2006 under the leadership of MCA Hall of Fame Coaches Scott King and Tad Schye. In 2024, Oxarart led the Mustangs to a 13-0 record and the Class B State title. Jake Eldridge Football

Jake Eldridge, head Havre High Football Coach, and his Blue Ponies finished the '24 season as Class A Semi-finalists. He has spent 17 years coaching in MT at the college and high school level. Before Havre, Jake was 3 years as head of both FB & T&F at Box Elder. He spent 10 years coaching at MSU-N as an Offensive Assistant/Running Backs Coach (3 yrs), Defensive Assistant/Defensive Coordinator (7 yrs), Head Strength and Conditioning Coordinator (10 yrs) and Interim Head Football Coach (2 yrs). Jake is a Helena Capital graduate and played at MSU-N for coach Mark Samson. Topic: "Cover 2"



Rob Stanton Football

Rob Stanton has been the head coach at Billings West for the past 10 years. His teams have made the playoffs all 10 years including 10 quarter final appearances, 5 semi-final appearances, 3 state championship appearances and 1 state title. Rob is also the head track and field coach at West, taking home 9 state championships. Topic: "West High Program and Running Back Drills"



Anita Foster Volleyball

Anita's head coaching career began in 2020 at Billings Central. In her first 5 seasons, the Rams won 4 of 5 state championships (2020-22, 24) along with a 2023 runner-up finish. With an overall record of 108-25, she's been recognized as the MCA's Class A Volleyball COY 4x while also being named the 2023 NFHS All-Region COY. Anita is the Director of Ascent Volleyball Club, and she also coaches elite high school girls' national lacrosse travel teams. Anita coached youth sports for over 20 years. At Hardin she played for Laura Sundheim on multiple state championship teams, and then for Coach Dave Gantt and the MSU Bobcats. Taylor Els Volleyball

Taylor Els just finished her 4th season as a Bobcat VB assistant. She has played an integral role on the defensively, making the Bobcats one of the most efficient units in the Big Sky Conference. The Bobcats completed the 2024 campaign averaging 15.4 digs and 2.56 blocks per set. MSU also finished first in the Big Sky Conference allowing just 1.42 aces per contest. Prior to Bozeman, Els was a volunteer assistant at Michigan State. As an athlete, she was Northern Colorado's primary libero from 2016-19 and NCAA Division I career digs record holder (1,818). McKinna Yerbich Volleyball

McKinna Yerbich, head VB coach at Circle HS, is a Circle native & graduate. In just her 3rd year of taking over the program for the Wildcats, and she received the 2024 MCA COY Award, a 32-0 undefeated season, a career record of 79-14, & a State Championship Title. During her time as head coach (2022-2024), Yerbich & The Circle Wildcats have been 2x Conference Champions, 1x 2C District Champions, 2x Eastern C Divisional Champions, have made 2 State Tournament appearances, and 1x Class C State Champions. Erika Gustavsen Volleyball

Erika Gustavsen has coached 20 years in Montana, serving 8 years as a head volleyball coach with 4 years at Bozeman, 4 years now at Gallatin, and 7 years as a head GBB coach. Her teams have made the AA state tournament all seven seasons, winning state titles in '15 and '24 and placing 3rd in '14 and '23. She has a 163-38 record and was select as MCA COY in 2015-2016 for volleyball and girls' basketball and again received volleyball COY honors in 2024. This will be Erika's 4th time speaking at the clinic. Topics: "Team Building & Mental Preparation" & "Practice Drills"



Aubrey Beaumont Volleyball

Coach Beaumont became RMC's head volleyball coach in '24 with 5 returning senior starters leading the Bears to 13-19 season. Before RMC, Aubrey was the head coach at Lindsey Wilson College in KY, leading the Blue Raiders to a 19-15 overall record and runners-up in the Mid-South Conference Tournament. She was a setter for Jamestown and then was graduate assistant for 2 years, followed by 2 seasons as assistant at McPherson College with a 45-30 overall record and a birth to the 2021-22 NAIA Tournament. Overall, Beaumont has made 6 trips to the NAIA Tournament as a player and coach. Topic: "The Do's & Don'ts for Recruitment" & "Mental Toughness Drills"



Carmen Harbach Volleyball

In her 21 years as head volleyball coach at Gardiner High, Carmen Harbach led the Bruins to 10 state tournament appearances, earning 3rd place in 2009, 2010 and 2017, 2nd place in 2024 and state championship honors in 2012, 2013 & 2014. A graduate of Billings West, she went on to play four years of volleyball at Eastern Montana College. She is a 3x MCA COY recipient, and this is her 2nd time speaking at the clinic. Iona Stookey Volleyball

Iona has coached 39 years in Montana, 35 as the head VB coach at Huntley Project. Her Lady Red Devils have won 19 District titles, 19 Divisional titles, and 16 State Championships along with 987 career wins. Iona is a 16x MCA COY, a 6x National COY finalist, the 2024 NHSACA Volleyball COY and was the 2020-21 National Federation HS VB COY. Iona was also selected as the AVCA Region 11 COY in '23 and the "10 Big Sky State Games National Female "Athlete of the Year". Iona was inducted into the 2016 EMC/MSUB Athletic HOF and was the 2017 MCA HOF. This is Iona's 8th time speaking at the clinic. TOPIC: Skills and Drills



Jim Klemann AD

Jim Klemann began his tenure as Rocky Mountain College's athletic director in 2021. He previously spent 17 years at the University of Jamestown. Battlin' Bears Athletics has seen tremendous success under Klemann's direction, including 189 All-Conference honorees, 70 All-Americans, and over 300 Academic All-Conference honorees. Rocky's athletic department boasted a 3.31 cumulative GPA during the 2023-24 academic year. Coaches and administrators have flourished under Klemann's leadership, as four coaches have been named Conference COY. Klemann has led department growth with the launch of the Battlin' Bears Booster Club and a new corporate sponsorship program involving community members and corporate partners to enhance Rocky's gameday experience. Mark Durham AD

Mark grew up in Three Forks. He was a HOF basketball player at Western Montana College and then stayed on as an assistant coach for 2 years. Mark taught and coached at Gardiner, Northern Montana College, Miles Community College, and then back to his alma mater WMC to be the 3rd coach in history of the men's basketball program. After 11 years, Mark switched to Athletic Director where he served for 5 years. Since 2012 he has lived in Bozeman doing commercial insurance. Mark has been the NIL Director for Montana State men's basketball for the past 3 years. Topic: NIL, Collective, etc.



Mark Dennehy AD

Mark has dedicated 25 years serving as AD and assistant principal in Kalispell, leading Glacier for the past 18 years after 7 years at Flathead. Under his leadership, both schools have seen strong participation numbers and strong coach longevity. He has also led multiple building project initiatives in the district. Topic: "Taking Care of Kids, Coaches, and the Community."



Bill Himmelberg Basketball

In 14 seasons as the women's head basketball coach at the University of Providence, Himmelberg led his Lady Argos to the NAIA tournament 9/10 years. Under Himmelberg's leadership, the Argos have a school record of 277 wins and have broken 29 different school records. His '24-25 team won their 2nd straight Frontier Conference Championship advancing to the NAIA tournament. In '23-24 he coached the Lady Argos to a program record in wins and a NAIA National Runner-Up finish. A fixture at both UP and in the Great Falls community for decades, Himmelberg has enjoyed unprecedented success as the leader of UP's Women's Basketball. Topic: "Early Offense & Man Sets"



James Bulluck Basketball

Coach James Bulluck, a Skyview High alum, passionately mentors young athletes. After playing at Sheridan, Regis, and Rocky Mountain College (part of their 2009 championship team), he coached at Rocky for nine years. Returning to Skyview, he coached freshman girls and volunteered with the boys before becoming the head coach and leading them to the 2025 AA State Championship. Bulluck remains a dedicated coach and community pillar. Topic: "Team First: Coaching through Relationships"



Wade Murphy Basketball

Coach Murphy has spent the last 18 years at Dawson County High as the head boys' basketball coach. His Red Devils have qualified for the State A Tournament the past 4 years. Before Dawson, he was the head BBB at Peyton High in CO and the GBB head at Kemmerer High in WY. Murphy started out as an assistant for Bill Triplett in Reed Point and his first head position was at Roberts, coaching BBB. He is currently the weights instructor and AD at Dawson County. Topic: "Developing and Maintaining a Competitive Program"



Pat Jensen Basketball

Pat Jensen recently completed his 2nd season as MT-Western's Head Men's Basketball Coach and his 7th season with the Bulldogs. His '24-25 Bulldogs finished the season with a 16-13 record, and first winning record in league play in 7 years. In his first season at the helm, the Bulldogs had an overall record of 14-16, highlighted by the first win over a top 10 ranked team since the '19-20 season, defeating #10, Arizona Christian. Prior to MT-W, Jensen spent 3 seasons with Idaho State. Jensen played at MSU-N from 2010-15, where he was part of 2 regular season and postseason Frontier Conference Championships, along with 4 appearances in the NAIA National. Drew Muscatell Basketball

Over 7 years at the University of Idaho, Drew Muscatell has risen to Associate Head Coach, playing a key role in the Vandals' success since 2018. He leads forward and post player development, scouts opponents, and crafts defensive game plans for much of the season. Muscatell was recognized by Silver Waves Media as a Most Impactful Mid-Major Assistant and was named to the WBCA "30-Under-30" list. Taylor Cummings Basketball

Coach Cummings, a Belt native, just completed her second season as head coach of Gallatin High's girls' basketball program, leading the Raptors to their first-ever State Title. A former MSU-Northern player (2011-2015), she began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Black Hills State. She then served as an assistant at Sheridan College (2017-2019) before returning to Montana. In MT she assisted at Lone Peak and Bozeman before accepting the head position at Gallatin in 2023.



Chase Tait Basketball

Coach Tait recently completed his 16th season as head men's basketball coach at Miles CC, leading the '24-25 Pioneers to a 15-17 record with an exciting, high-scoring style averaging over 93 ppg. A Polson High and MSU graduate, Tait first assisted Bozeman HS girls and then spent 8 seasons as head GBB and 5 as head BBB coach in Fairfield, coached in 7 state championship games as both head and assistant coach. He began his collegiate coaching at Tech, then coached the Huntley Project girls, was assistant men's coach at UM-Western before settling at MCC. Topic: "How my Perspective has Changed"



Frankie Bignell Basketball

Frankie Bignell joined MT Tech women's BB staff in 2023, returning to Big Sky Country after serving as the graduate assistant coach at Angelo State University in San Angelo, TX. Prior to Angelo State, Bignell assisted at MSU-N, Sheridan College (WY), and Capital High. Bignell competed for MT-Western helping the Bulldogs to appearances in the NAIA tournament's semifinals and Round of 16 in her senior and junior seasons. She is a Drummond graduate, where she was a 4 sport standout. Topics: "Post Finesse, S&C Workouts & Assistant Duties"



Chris Jessop T&F Throws

Jessop is in his 9th year as a T&F assistant at Hamilton. In his first five seasons, his throwers set all six school records across the three throwing events. He has coached 5 state champions, 8 runners-up, and 18 state placers. Highlights include: five women's shot put state qualifiers in one season, three men's discus state placers in 2017, three women's shot placers in 2024, two nationally ranked javelin throwers, and top-3 state placers in all three women's events. Jessop competed at MSU in discus, weight, and hammer. Topics: Throws - "Glide Shot", "Rotational Shot", "Discus" and "Javelin"



Shannon Flynn XC/T&F Distance

Shannon Flynn became the Carroll College Fighting Saints XC and T&F Distance Coach in 2019. Her '24-25 XC men captured their 4th consecutive Frontier Conference Championship, while the women placed 2nd. At the NAIA National Championship, and the men finished 12th, the program's best finish since 2015. Flynn was named Frontier Conference Men's XC COY for the 2015, and the women placed 25th. Flynn was inducted into the 2023 Carroll Athletics HOF. Prior, Flynn assisted distance runners at Univ. of MT. Topics: "Coaching the Other 22 Hours in Distance" & "Keeping it Simple-Distance Training"

Diego Hammett XC/T&F Distance

Diego Hammett is the Missoula Sentinel head XC coach and serves also as their T&F distance coach. Hammett's 2019 AA XC boys finished 3rd in state; were XC State Champs in 2020, 2nd place in 2021 & 3rd place in 2022 with his girls placing 3rd in 2015. Hammett was a part of the Sentinel T&F State Championship teams for both boys (2019, '21 & '22) and girls (2017, '18 & '21). He had coaching stints at Harlem, Lane Deer and Browning before settling at Sentinel. He ran XC and T&F at North Idaho College, is a 1990 Butte High graduate and an enrolled member of the Gros Ventre Tribe of Ft. Belknap.



Erica Fraley T&F-Pole Vault

Erica Fraley is in her 3rd season as Montana's vertical jumps coach. A world-renown pole vaulter, Fraley has extensive coaching experience at the international, collegiate and high school levels. She represented USA at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, and was on coaching staff for 2013 World Youth Championships in Donetsk, Ukraine. Before coaching at the collegiate level, Erica established a pole vault training facility and club, where she developed numerous HS state champions, National Champion and All-Americans. As the pioneer female pole vaulter at Texas A&M, she was a 2x Big XII champion and 3x NCAA qualifier.



Louis Faust T&F - Jumps

Louis Faust has been the triple, long and high jump coach at Frenchtown since 2021, taking over as head T&F coach in '23. Before Frenchtown he coached high jump for a season at Beaverhead County High. Over 5 seasons he has coached 12 individual Class A all-state performances, and 2 individual state champions, as well as broken multiple school records. Faust competed collegiately at Concordia University - Portland in the long, triple, and high jump. He was a GNAC all conference performer in the triple and high. Topics: Long Jump & Triple Jump



Sarah Jambor XC/T&F Distance

Sarah Jambor is in her fourth season as Head XC Coach and fifth as Assistant Track Coach at Manhattan High School, working with long sprints, middle distance, distance, and cross country athletes. During her time, the girls' XC team won state titles in 2024 and 2025, with a runner-up finish in 2023; the boys won state in 2025 and placed third in 2024. Prior to Manhattan, Sarah coached at Dallas Baptist University, where her teams made three NCAA DII XC Championship appearances and produced several All-American athletes. She ran mid-distance and XC at Southern Nazarene University in Oklahoma City.



Spencer Huls T&F - Hurdles

Spencer Huls has been the head T&F coach at Corvallis for 22 seasons, taking the boys' program in 2004, and the girls in 2008. His teams have won 15 state titles with an additional 11 top three finishes. Hurdlers coached by Huls have held a share of the Class A boys 110 Hurdle State Record as well as holding both 100 and 300 hurdle Class A records on the girls' side. Three different Corvallis women hurdlers hold three of the four top times in Class A State Meet history, and Olivia Lewis holds the all-class record by over a second in the 300 hurdles Topic: "High Hurdles" & "Intermediate Hurdles"



Jim Epperly T&F - High Jump

Jim Epperly has coached multiple sports for 35 years at Noxon and Bigfork, with multiple district, divisional and state champions in the high jump. He was named MCA Assistant COY in 2015 and is a three-time NHSACA Assistant Coach of the Year Finalist. Jim has assisted 3x MCA COY, Sue Loeffler's track program since 2001, coaching jumps for girls and boys. Joe Yegge Softball

Joe Yegge became the head MSUB Softball Coach in 2024-25, bringing a successful 28 year record, including 18 seasons as a head coach with a career record total of 783-362 (.684). 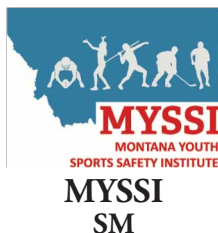
Derek Waddoups Baseball

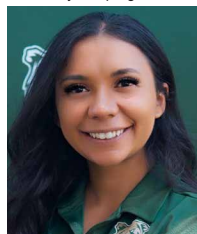
Cole Mendenhall Wrestling

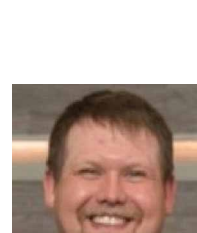
Tim Bakker Golf
