### Sandy Zimmerman Keynote

Sandy is an award-winning teacher, coach, athlete, and inspirational speaker whose story reminds us that no dream is out of reach. Sandy taught and coached for 23 years. She is best known as a 10x competitor on NBC's hit show American Ninja Warrior, becoming the first mom to finish the course and hit the buzzer. Sandy has taken her message of strength and perseverance to audiences on The Kelly Clarkson Show, CNN, E! News and more. Sandy was inducted into the 2022 National PE Teacher HOF, is a TEDx speaker, a national judo champion, and a former Gonzaga BB player who still coaches with the Warriors today. Via her book *Get Out of the Car* and motivational talks, Sandy inspires people to break through excuses and push past obstacles to achieve what once seemed impossible. **Topics:** From Welfare to Warrior: 5 Strategies to Build Life-Changing Connections with Habits-Athletes and 5 Crucial Skills for High Performance



### Mark Albert Keynote

Coach Albert served 31 years as a teacher and coach, the vast majority at Hamilton HS where he pioneered a personal finance and personal development class. He was head XC coach for 20 years and spent two successful stints as the head GBB coach, playing for the state championship in '09, '14 and winning it all in 2015. His boys XC teams won 5 state titles from 2008-21. Mark was inducted into the MCA HOF in 2022. He and wife Carla now mentor young adults in their use of time and money and they speak to teachers and coaches on how committing to personal development compounds, positively impacting the students and athletes they lead. **Topic: Invest in yourself, impact your athletes: How coaches can survive and thrive in today's ultra-critical culture.**



### Bobby Kennedy Football

Bobby Kennedy, a 30+ year coaching veteran, with a national championship pedigree, was named Montana's 38th head FB coach in 2026. He took over as head coach after one season as the Grizzlies' wide receivers coach in 2025. He spent the 2024 season at Rice, and lists stops at Stanford, Iowa, Colorado, Texas, Washington, Wake Forest and more on his lengthy resume. Kennedy has coached in 17 bowl games, two BCS championship games, two Rose Bowls, one Fiesta Bowl, and helped Montana reach the FCS Semifinal in 2025. In his first season with the Griz, he helped produce one of the best passing attacks in program history and the best scoring offense in the Big Sky (13-2 record averaging 457 yards and 41 ppg). **Topic: Culture (The Family You Choose) and Easy Red Zone Concepts**



### Olivia Lane T&F - LJ & TJ

Olivia Lane joined the MSU T&F coaching staff in 2024, coaching the TJ, LJ, and multi-events. In her short time at Montana State, Lane has coached 6 Big Sky Conference scorers, 3 of whom earned medals in their respective events at the Big Sky Championships. The native of Clarkston, WA, comes to Bozeman after 2 seasons assisting at the University of ND. Lane also coached at Ashland University ('21-'22), where she helped the Eagles' men's team finish as the national runner-up at the '22 NCAA Division II Indoor T&F Championships. Lane was a standout heptathlete at Eastern Oregon, earning All-American honors, finishing 9th at the NAI A Outdoor T&F Championships in '21 and 12th at the '19 national meet. Lane also placed 8th in the pentathlon to earn an All-American nod at the NAI A Indoor T&F Championships in '20.



### Bobby Daly Football

Bobby Daly returned to MSU, his alma mater, as the defensive coordinator for 2026. In 2024 as DC, he led a unit that finished 11th in the FCS in points allowed (18.3) and 15th in yards allowed (311.9). In 2025 Daly became the DC for UTEP where he led the defense to a top-5 finish in 3rd down % at the FBS level. The Helena Capital product became Assistant Head Coach in 2022 while continuing to lead the program's in-state recruiting efforts. Daly coached at Idaho from '13-18. As a Bobcat he logged 382 tackles, 4th in program history, earning 1st Team All-America honors in '07 and HM in '08. Like his father J. before him and brother Brad after, Bobby Daly was a Bobcat team captain. He is also a Bobcat Athletics Hall of Famer. **Topic: Game Week Preparation**



### Shawn Neary Basketball

Butte native, Shawn Neary, just completed his 30th season as head men's basketball coach with 549 career college wins. Neary started the program at Gillette College in 2009. His Pronghorns have won 337 games in 14 seasons for an average of 24 wins a season and a 75% winning percentage. They notched two Region IX Championships, made 3 NJCAA National Tournament appearances, with a third-place finish in 2016 and won 5 Region IX North regular season titles ('14, '16, '17, '24, '25). Coach Neary's Pronghorns have a winning record (4-3) at the NJCAA National Tournament. Neary has received 7 Region IX COY Awards. He began his college head coaching career at Miles Community College in 1996, serving there for 13 seasons.

### Matt Logie Basketball

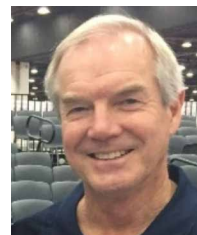
Matt Logie enters his 4th year at the helm of the MSU men's basketball program. Logie has an overall 326-108 career over 15 seasons, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament in 12 of his 15 years at 3 institutions. He is the 2nd men's coach in college BB history to lead a team to the NCAA Tournament at the Division I, II, and III levels. Logie arrived at MSU after 4 seasons at Point Loma (82-23), 8 seasons at Whitworth (194-35). Earlier, Matt assisted and played at Lehigh where he hit 262 3-pointers and was a 90.7% free throw shooter. Honors include the '22-23 PacWest COY, NABC DII West District COY, 3x NWC COY, 2x Glenn Robinson National COY finalist and finalist for the '23-24 Joe B. Hall National COY after orchestrating the Bobcats' 3rd straight Big Sky championship title and NCAA Tournament berth.



### Scott Keister Volleyball

Scott Keister enters his 2nd season as head coach of the Montana State University Billings Volleyball Program. Keister brings 27 years of coaching experience, including 22 years at the collegiate level. Prior to MSUB, he coached at Northwest College (WY), Salt Lake CC, MSU (Bozeman), Westminster College (UT) and University of Utah. Keister has over 20 years of club coaching experience in MT, UT and WY. He also has international coaching experience through the USA High Performance program and was a program director for Intermountain USA VB in Salt Lake City. **Topics: Out of System Attacking & Creating Intentional Practices that Transfer to Game Day (Purpose, Efficiency, Effectiveness, Progression)**

### Dennis Janzen Volleyball

Dennis Janzen, a multiple HOF coach and leader, built one of the most dominant programs in collegiate volleyball history at Fresno Pacific University. Over 27 years as head women's coach, his teams captured 6 NAI A national titles, earned 20 national tournament berths, and totaled over 900 victories. His 2001-2010 stretch (373-18) stands among the most successful decades ever, highlighted by sustained top national rankings and extraordinary winning streaks. Janzen was named the NAI A National COY four times. Janzen's coaching impact extends nationally and internationally with the USA Men's National Team, 3 USA Women's Collegiate National Teams, and the Singapore Men's and Women's National Teams. ### Kyle Erickson Basketball

Kyle Erickson, a Broadview native, recently completed his 3rd season as head coach at the College of Idaho. He has led the Yotes to two NAI A National Tournament appearances, advancing to the second round both times. This past season Erickson guided the team to a 22-9 overall record and 21 regular-season wins—the program's most since 2008-09. Previously, Erickson spent 5 seasons as an assistant at Pacific University, with additional coaching stops at MSU Billings, Rocky Mountain College, and Miles Community College, plus experience playing and coaching in Italy. He played collegiately at MT-Western from 2007-2012, under HOF Coach Steve Keller.



### Jake Von Scherrer AD

Career educator, Dr. Jake von Scherrer, retired in 2021 after 41 years as an award-winning teacher, coach, and athletic director. Jake, a 12-time COY, now serves as a High School and NCAA Official and is a sought-after speaker and consultant. Jake was inducted into two Hall of Fames and in 2024, received the Bruce Brown Distinguished Service Award from the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association for his work in Sportsmanship, Professional Development, and Student Leadership. Six years ago, Jake created the Educational AD Podcast which is heard in all 50 states plus 131 countries. The Podcast has led to 6 bestselling books in The Athletic Director's Toolbox Series. **Topics: Essential Tools for Essential Leaders and Best Practices for Championship Parents**



### Bunny Bruning Tennis

Bunny Bruning is an RSPA Master Professional with over 45 years of experience teaching and coaching racquet sports. She is a certified specialist in Competitive Player Development (High Performance Coaching) and Mental Toughness. In 2023, Bunny founded Women Coaching Racquet Sports with a mission to educate, mentor, engage, and inspire more women to become racquet sport coaches. She retired in 2024 after 42 years as Tennis Director at Wakonda Club, but she continues to teach and inspire players of all ages. She was inducted into the RSPA Missouri Valley HOF and has earned numerous other prestigious awards. She is currently president of the Central Iowa Tennis Alliance. Before her distinguished coaching career, Bunny completed 9 years on the WTA professional tennis tour, achieving world rankings: #41-singles, #11-doubles, and #4-U.S. professional doubles.



### Chris Mouat Basketball

Helena native, Chris Mouat, just completed his 21st season as the head women's basketball coach at MSU-N. In 2017, Mouat became the all-time winningest coach in Skylight history. His 2025-26 Skylights led the entire NAIA in 3-point %. He has guided the Skylights to 5 NAIA National Tournaments, advancing to the Sweet 16 4x and the Elite 8 once. He has coached 9 All-Americans, 2 Frontier MVP's, and 4 Defensive MVP's. Prior to MSU-N, Mouat worked in the WBB programs at both RMC and MT Tech. He began his career at Helena High, followed by a stint as the head GBB coach at Butte. He was named the 2015 Frontier Conference COY, awarded the 2018 MSU-Northern "Golden NU" Award and inducted into the MSU-Northern Athletic HOF in 2025.



### Sierra Woodward Basketball

Sierra completed her 7th season as Skylight assistant and 3rd as the Associate Head. She served as a student assistant during the 2017-18 season. She had a successful 2-year career as a player, helping the Skylights to 2 consecutive NAIA National Tournaments (including a Sweet 16 appearance in 2017) and an overall record of 47-18. Woodward directs the Skylight strength program and works with post players. She excelled in both softball and basketball at Kelso HS (WA) and Lower Columbia College. **TOPIC: Post Drills & Post Play-High Low Action**



### Tommy Brown Basketball

Tommy Brown recently completed his 2nd season as the Head Girls' Basketball Coach at Havre. The Blue Ponies finished the 2025-26 season as Class A State Champions with a 21-3 record and led Class A in allowing the fewest opponent ppg. In Brown's first season as head coach ('24-25), the Blue Ponies finished 3rd place. Brown served 2 years as an assistant coach under former Havre GBB Coach, Dustin Kraske. **Topic: Defensive Skill Work and Early Coaching Career Challenges**



### Jay Shumaker Basketball

He has completed 31 seasons as a head varsity basketball coach. He began his coaching career at Plevna in 1992, first as a junior high and high school assistant, before being promoted to head girls and later, head boys coach. In 2002 he became the head boys coach at Baker and spent 15 seasons with them before switching to the girls' program. He has now coached over 700 varsity boys and girls' basketball games between his time at Plevna and Baker. In March, his Baker girls won the Class B State title and went 26-0 on the season. **Topic: Zone offense, 3-point shooting drills, and college recruits**



### Brodie Kelly Basketball

Brodie Kelly has served as Head Boys Basketball Coach at Butte Central for 22 seasons, leading the Maroons to 19 state tournament appearances. His teams reached the state semifinals 13 times, advanced to 4 championship games, and captured 2 state titles. He played at Montana Tech under Rick Dessing. His program's defensive principles and motion offense concepts are rooted in Dessing's 1990s system, consistently producing teams that rank among the best in points allowed and fewest turnovers committed. **Topic: Practice with Purpose: Building Offensive Drills for Your System & Half-Court Man Defense**



### Evan Epperly Basketball

Evan Epperly has served as Glacier's head boys' basketball coach for the past 2 seasons and as an assistant for years prior. As an assistant, Epperly has helped the Wolfpack to a 3rd place AA BBB state trophy (2023) and three straight AA state championship FB appearances (2023-25), including a 13-0 record and the AA State FB Championship this past season. Previously, he was a football assistant at both Carroll and Montana. A Glacier alum, Evan played football at Montana. **Topic: "Running a Program as a First Time Head Coach."**



### Grady Bennett Football

Bennett, a 1986 Flathead graduate, was a 3-sport, 1st-team all-state athlete. He started at QB 3 seasons for the Grizzlies 1988-90. After a tryout with the BC Lions, he started his coaching career back at his alma mater. Following 13 seasons as an assistant, Bennett became the Braves head FB coach for 3 seasons '04-06. When Glacier opened in 2007, he moved to become the first and only head FB coach in the school's 19-year history leading the Wolfpack to their 2nd state championship this past season. Grady has coached FB for 35 years, BB for 21 years, and now T&F for 3. **Topic: The vertical passing game.**



### AJ Wilson Football

AJ enters his 3rd year as the head FB coach at CMR High. Prior to CMR, Wilson spent 1 year coaching DL at MT Western, another year at Chadron State (NE) and 6 years at Spring Creek High (NV), serving as 4-year FB assistant, taking over as head mentor his final 2 seasons. He also assisted in BB and T&F at Spring Creek, heading up a very successful T&F team in 2023. A Helena native, AJ was a member of 2 Capital State Championship Teams garnering Montana Co-Defensive POY in 2011. At MT Western Wilson earned Frontier Conference Defensive POY in '15, along with 1st team All American. **Topic: CMR Program and Linebacker Drills**



### Seth Mason Football

Seth Mason has spent 2 years as head FB coach for Frenchtown. His Broncs have gone 20-2, won 2 conference titles and the 2025 State Championship. Prior to that, he was a 4-year assistant at Frenchtown and assisted at Mission High School for 3 years. He has also been an assistant in GBB, BBB, and Track. Seth played football and graduated from Montana Western. **Topic: Implementing Culture and Practicing Efficiently**



### Brock Berryhill Football

Brock Berryhill recently completed his 12th year as head coach at Scobey High where he has amassed a 78-40 record with 8 playoff appearances and the 2025 8-man state title. He has coached 28 years at the high school and college levels, including the secondary at Cal Poly SLO, University of Tulsa, Southeastern Oklahoma State, and Montana State. He entered teaching and coaching as the head coach at Twin Falls High, followed by a 6-year stint as defensive coordinator at Boise High School before bringing his family to Scobey. Brock was named MCA 8-man COY in 2025 and was a finalist in 2024. **Topic: Fly Sweep and play tunneling**



### Tyler Palmer Football

Coach Palmer just finished his 4th season as the Offensive Coordinator for the Three Forks Wolves. In the past 3 years the Wolves have made the quarterfinals twice and were this year's state runner-up. The Wolves have finished each of the past 3 seasons with a top 3 rusher, passer and receiver in Class B. Tyler teaches S&C and leads the Three Forks Fellowship of Christian Athletes. **Topic: Structuring your offensive meetings to efficiently use time and maximize game planning.**



### Matt Johnson Football

Matt graduated from Anaconda High School in 1996. Matt attended the University of Montana where he played football. Matt student taught at Big Sky High School in 2001, where he began his coaching career as a freshman coach and was also hired to be the sprint and relay coach for the track team. As an assistant, under HOF coach Gary Ekegren, Matt coached O-Line, D-Line, Linebackers, and Running backs. In 2010 Matt became the head football coach at Big Sky and in 2026 he led the Eagles to the semi-finals. **Topic: Turnover Drills Circuit, Special Team Drills**



### Jim Vinson Football

Jim Vinson started his coaching career at GFHS in 1985, coaching freshmen for 3 years. He returned to coaching in 1998 at Valier for 7 seasons, 2 years as varsity head coach. He stepped into the head football position at CJJ in 2006. His 2025 Hawks went 11-1, winning the 6-man state title. **Topic: Development and Progression of Running Backs**



### Colin Fuller Football

Colin enters his 2<sup>nd</sup> season as Special Teams Coordinator and Defensive Assistant at Glacier. He has had prior high school coaching experience at Flathead and Hardin bringing experience on both sides of the ball. His collegiate background includes coaching stops at The University of Montana-Western, Adams State University (CO), and Carroll College. **Topic: Special Teams Unit**



### Lee Carter S&C (all Sports)

Coach Carter teaches weight training at Capital High and served earlier as Powerlifting coach. Carter has played an integral role in developing and leading summer S&C programs, including weight training, Dots, and plyometric speed and conditioning. As a competitive powerlifter, Lee earned both state and national records. Carter has mentored numerous athletes who have gone on to compete at the NAIA and NCAA Levels, as well as powerlifters achieving state, national, and world records. **Topic: Plus of competitive lifting & Building a Weight Program.**

Latisha is the head Cheer coach at RMC, serves as Montana's UCA Head Instructor. She is Montana's first athlete to compete at The Cheer-leading Worlds and serves as MCA Cheer Sport Chair and Speaker. Her 10 years of coaching experience include the MT East-West Shrine Game, 4-year athlete at MSU-Bozeman, Laurel High, Billings All Stars, and the Nfinity Stunt Team. Latisha is an NFHS stunt-certified coach with a strong background in both cheer and dance.



### Danielle Jorgenson Cheer

Danielle is an Assistant Cheer Coach at RMC. She serves as a Montana UCA Instructor and assists with Montana Cheer Experts. She has been a key speaker at the MCA Clinic and is a 4-year assistant coach for the Montana East-West Shrine Game. She brings 8 years of cheer experience, including 4 years as a collegiate athlete at RMC and four years at Skyview.



### Rayna Phelps Cheer

Rayna took over the Fergus HS Cheer program in 2023 after working with the JH & HS programs. Morse has coached 6 state champions and 28 All-Staters in the sprints, relays and hurdles. He ran track for the University of Mary and the University of Montana. Kyle Stanton is in his 3rd year as head T&F coach at CCDHS in Miles City. During his 3 seasons, CCDHS T&F participation has increased from around 40 athletes to now over 90 each season. The girls' team won the 2025 Eastern A Division trophy with at least one athlete placing in each of the 17 events. The Cowgirl 4x400 girls relay team and 800 runner, Peyton Frame, were 2025 State Champs. Andrew Mozer has been involved in the high jump for Helena High since 2002, as an athlete and mentor to middle schoolers. He left MSU as a two-time all-conference competitor and number 6 in MSU shot put history, and a three-time academic all-American. **Jim Peacock**

Jim Peacock has coached 21 years at Columbia Falls. As head XC coach since 2016, he has led teams to 3 Class A State Championships (2 boys, 1 girls), 2 runner-up trophies, and 5 thirds, earning him the MCA XC COY title 4 times. As a T&F assistant since 2011, he contributed to a 2011 boys' Class A State title, 5 seconds, and 1 third. His runners have achieved 54 Class A All-State placings and won 12 individual State A Champion medals. He also served 15 seasons as an assistant girls' basketball coach. Peacock ran at Jefferson HS for MCA and NHSACA HOF Coach, Sam Samson, and collegately for the U of M.

Brooke Dolan is in her 16th year as the head cross-country coach for Townsend / Broadwater high school. She also serves as the distance coach for track.
